

Postdoctoral Position at the Swiss Finance Institute at EPFL

The Swiss Finance Institute at EPLF seeks one postdoctoral researcher to study the interactions between the financial sector and real economy. The postdoctoral position will be funded by the Sinergia grant "Empirics of Financial Stability" from the Swiss National Science Foundation.

Sinergia Project "Empirics of Financial Stability"

The global financial crisis in recent years has uncovered fundamental weaknesses in the financial architecture of modern economies. Such financial fragility poses major challenges to the functioning of the financial system, the real economy, and society. The goal of this research project is to explore the sources, channels, and consequences of frictions in the financial sector for financial instability. Four research teams located in Geneva, Lausanne, and St. Gallen will cooperate to reach this ambitious goal.
