Perspectives on Actuarial Risks in Talks of Young researchers

January 24 – 29, 2027

This international Winter School is targeted at young researchers (PhD students and researchers, academics, practitioners within 5 years of PhD graduation) working on current actuarial science topics. This new edition aims to gather experts from different fields to answer the following question:

Risk-transfer or risk-sharing? Which one to choose?

Although risk-sharing predates insurance and appeared very early in human history, risk-transfer is the common mechanism used in modern society to manage risks. Actuarial science was key in developing such risk-transfer mechanisms by creating sustainable insurance products based on rigorous methods for valuing risks. However, more recently, risk-sharing mechanisms started to emerge in some countries. With the key challenges our society is facing, e.g. climate change, social inequalities, and artificial intelligence, the question arises as how these two different risk management techniques should be used, selected or combined. This is why the 2027 edition of PARTY would like to foster research on such questions.

Young researchers across disciplines, such as actuarial science, demography, insurance, mathematics, statistics, epidemiology, biology and economics are encouraged to participate, present and freely discuss among each other their most relevant questions in their specific fields. Invited experts from academia and practice will be available for feedback and will provide opening and closing remarks.
