#### Presentation of the Conference

The current irreversible digitalisation process of society poses new technical challenges for private and public decision-makers. To avoid making decisions based only on intuitions and feelings, any choice must make the most effective use of the growing amount of information available. Private companies and central or local government agencies greatly benefit from in-house expertise in the statistical analysis of this information. This conference aims to discuss how applied statistics can support private and public decision-makers in their decision-making process and be the forum where decision-makers express their knowledge needs to the audience of applied statisticians. As in its tradition, the ASA conference is also, open to contributions on statistics in its various fields of application, even outside the more specific topic chosen for this specific edition.

#### Submission of abstracts and contributed papers

Contributed papers are welcome. Concerned scholars are invited to submit to the Scientific Committee an abstract in English, of no more than 300 words, including title, authors' name, company or institution they belong to, and email.

Authors are also invited to submit a 4-6 page short paper in addition to the abstract of their presentation. Selected short papers will be published, after peer review, in the **Book of Short Papers of the ASA Conference 2022** - *Data-Driven Decision Making*, with ISBN.

The official conference languages will be Italian and English. A good practice would be to write the slides in English, so that non-Italian participants can follow all presentations.

#### Conference Deadlines

- April 30st, 2022: abstract submission (max 300 words).
- **June 15**th, **2022**: short paper (4 6 pages) submission, only for those who wish to have it published in the conference Book of short papers (with ISBN).
- **July 15**th, **2022:** upload of the final version of the submitted short papers, after the review process.
- **July 31**st, **2022:** early bird reduced accreditation fees (€100), special early bird reduced fees for junior participants\* (€50).

Regular accreditation fees from August 1st, 2022: € 130 (for junior\* participants € 65).

**Accreditation fees are requested to at least one of the authors of each contribution** (abstract and/or short paper) and for any participant to the conference.

\*Junior participants are students and unstructured staff under 33 years old.

#### **Publications**

Selected short papers will be published by the Genova University Press in the **Book of Short Papers of the ASA Conference 2022** *- Statistics and policy-making,* with ISBN.

The conference organisers will allow, after a 'blind refereeing' process, the publication of the full texts of the invited papers and a selection of the contributed papers in the following Scientific Journals:

- Micro & Macro Marketing
- Quality & Engineering
- Statistica Applicata Italian Journal of Applied Statistics

All listed journals currently publish in English; *Micro & Macro Marketing* and *Quality & Engineering* also host papers in Italian.

On the basis of the submitted abstracts, the Scientific Program Committee, joint with the board of the Journals, may decide to foresee thematic issues.
